DESCRIPTION: BCM 225 is designed to educate, train and prepare students for Summer short-term ministry projects – both through the Short-Term Missions Program at Gordon College as well as individual short-term projects. BCM 225 also complements BCM 226 (over the Summer) as part of the required courses for the Missions Minor.

OBJECTIVE: the goal of BCM 225 is to prepare individuals and teams for effective short-term missionary service. Training focuses on the myriad of issues encountered in short-term missionary service including:

- The biblical basis for missions and missionary service
- Cross-cultural communication, adaptation, and understanding
- Teamwork and relationship-building
- Confronting world views: our own and others
- Familiarity with the country and culture to be served
- Spiritual growth
- Administrative details related to short-term missionary service

EXPLANATION OF ASSIGNMENTS:

- 1) **Attendance/participation** in class (15%): be on time; be prepared
- 2) **1-page reflection-papers** on the assigned readings (three, 10% each = 30%). Reflect on required readings including things like – what you learned; points you agree or disagree with; how this book will help you in short-term missions. **Due MARCH 29 (Borthwick or Elmer*); APRIL 5 (Brewster), & APRIL 12 (Lingenfelter).**

****Note: if you've never taken BCM 215, then your reflection paper #1 should be on Borthwick's Six Dangerous Questions. If you've already taken BCM 215, then your reflection paper #1 should be on Duane Elmer's Cross-Cultural Servanthood.***

- 3) **Country Research Report (25%)** – 3-5 pages on the country and culture, people and background of the location where you are going to serve this Summer. **Due April 26.**

IF YOU ARE NOT GOING ON A TRIP THIS SUMMER, then this requirement is replaced with a 3-5 page review/reflection on Hoke & Taylor's Global Mission Handbook

- 4) **5-Page Paper (30%)** on either the subject of “Redemptive Analogies” or “Contextualization.” Imagine that you are writing a training-paper designed to help other short-term missionaries understand the term and how it applies in cross-cultural ministry. The paper should integrate readings, class lectures, suggested movies, and/or your own research. **Due May 8th.**
